SYNOPSIS:

This film views freedom as an undeniable value in human existence. It is set in Germany, in 1939. Hitler is a dictator at the head of a government that seeks to unite the mentality of all its citizens, under a murderous ideology called National Socialism – or Nazism.

A group of young boys use American music as a means of proclaiming their individuality and freedom in the face of Nazism. They call themselves the "Swing Kids", they wear unfashionable hats, they carry umbrellas and they wear their hair long.

However, what begins as an act of innocent, youthful rebellion, ends up becoming a dangerous political threat in the eyes of the established powers.

With excellent performances by Robert Sean Leonard (Dead Poets' Club) and Christian Bale (The Empire of the Sun), the film is an entertaining and dramatic celebration of individual freedom.
